



YEAR 2

SERVILLES L4 COMMERCIAL BARBERING

DURATION & HOURS: This programme is 34 weeks. Hours are between Monday – Friday from 8:45 am – 4:15 pm. International student fees: \$(\$17,500 Fees+ \$1,000 kit)

Our Barbering programme is all about gaining the skills and knowledge for graduates to go straight into working or owning their own barbershop. Learn indepth hair cutting, clipper skills and essential communication skills for operating a shop. Work placement is a part of the course to give our graduates an employment edge. You'll learn from industry experts and guest artists from respected Barbershops across Auckland and take part in creative photoshoots and competitions.

MAKEUP & SKINCARE L3

DURATION & HOURS: This course is 20 weeks. Hours are between Tuesday - Friday from 9:00 am - 3:30 pm. International student total fees: \$17,000 (\$16,000 fees + \$1,000 kit)

This programme will teach you the essential skills needed to start your career in the makeup industry. You will learn all things skincare, fashion and classic makeup application, product knowledge and consultation skills as well as photoshoots and industry-related work experiences. Freelance industry professionals are scheduled for workshops and visits to MAC for demos and topping up of kits.

MAKEUP ARTISTRY L4

In this programme you will take your makeup knowledge and application skills to the next level. Designed to give graduates a broad skill set to be a freelancer or work in Makeup teams, you will learn how to cater to a range of clients and environments, such as film, live performance and fashion (photographic, catwalk and SFX makeup), as well as beautician services like tanning. Level 4 covers the crucial business and marketing skills to make it in the makeup and freelancing world. You will also gain reallife experience working on fashion shows, theatre productions and photoshoots.

DRIVING IN NEW ZEALAND



When driving in New Zealand, remember these key rules:

Drive on the Left: All vehicles use the left-hand side of the road.

Know the Road Code: Familiarize yourself with the New Zealand Road Code, which explains the country's specific rules of the road. Pay special attention to the 'give way' rule.

Insurance Requirement: Ensure you have the necessary insurance to cover damage to others or their property. Seatbelts: By law, all vehicle occupants must wear seatbelts.

International Driver's License: If you hold a foreign driver's license or an international driving permit, you can drive in New Zealand for up to one year.

New Zealand License: To continue driving beyond one year, you must obtain a New Zealand driver's license.

License Types:

Learner License: Pass a theory test to begin driving with a supervisor. You can carry passengers with their consent, and if you use a driving instructor, expect to pay around \$50.00 per hour. Restricted License: After six months as a Learner Driver, you can attempt a practical driving test for a restricted

license. This allows solo driving between 5:00 am and 10:00 pm, with a supervisor required at other times.

Additional passengers are allowed with the supervisor's approval. Some drivers from specific countries may be exempt from the practical test.

Full License: If you're under 25, you can apply for a Full License after eighteen months as a Restricted License holder. If you're 25 or over, you can apply after six months. Holders of a full overseas driver's license can use it for one year after arriving in New Zealand, after which they must obtain a New Zealand driver's license. Alcohol and Driving: Never drink and drive. The legal blood alcohol limit for fully licensed drivers over 20 is 50 milligrams per 100 milliliters of blood, with severe penalties, including fines and jail terms, for violations. Your insurance will not cover accidents when driving under the influence.

Public Transport: Auckland offers a reliable public transport system, including buses, trains, and ferries. Convenient bus stops along major streets near Servilles Academy ensure easy access. Check timetables at www.at.govt.nz for efficient transportation to the academy.

LIVING IN AUCKLAND



Auckland Overview:

Auckland, New Zealand's largest city, located on the North Island, is home to over 1.6 million residents. Known as the City of Sails, Auckland boasts a diverse population, a pleasant climate, and stunning landscapes. Explore a range of indoor and outdoor activities in this culturally rich metropolis. Cost of Living:

To comfortably live in Auckland, budget approximately NZ\$20-25,000 per year for living expenses in addition to tuition fees, following New Zealand's immigration policy. Ensure you have some New Zealand currency for immediate expenses, and consider traveler's cheques for convenience. Foreign exchange offices are accessible at the airport, in the central business district, and at local banks.

Avoid carrying substantial cash amounts; instead, open a bank account shortly after arrival. Most major banks have branches on Queen Street, a short distance from the academy. You can make purchases with an EFTPOS card issued by your bank at most retailers. For larger transactions, opt for bank drafts or electronic transfers, as overseas cheques may face clearance challenges.

Currency:

New Zealand uses the New Zealand Dollar (NZD), available in various denominations, including coins (10c, 20c, 50c, \$1, \$2) and banknotes (\$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, \$100).

LIVING IN AUCKLAND



Accommodation Options:

Boarding Establishments (e.g., Hostel): Shared facilities with other students or travelers.

Private Board: Includes full board with meals and additional services.

Apartments or Flats: A cost-effective option near Servilles Academy with reduced transportation costs.

Cost of Flats:

Rent varies based on quality, location, and residents. A 3-4 weeks' rent bond is usually required. Additional costs: Around \$100/week for self-prepared meals, \$40/week for power, and \$20/week for a telephone.

Temporary Accommodation: Motels or hotels, with costs ranging from \$75 to \$200/night, depending on quality.

Your Own House: Renting your own house is an option.

Remember to budget for transportation, entertainment, and restaurant meals, as these expenses can vary among individuals.

GST (Goods and Services Tax): All prices include a 15% GST, as mandated by law.

Tipping and Service Charges: While tipping isn't expected, it's appreciated for exceptional service, and service charges aren't automatically added to hotel or restaurant bills.

SMOKING: Prohibited for those under 18, banned in most public and many private buildings, and not allowed in restaurants and hotel bars.

DRUGS & ALCOHOL: Strict laws require you to be 18 or older to purchase alcohol or enter bars. ID may be requested if you appear under 25. Non-prescription drug use is illegal.

ID / PROOF OF AGE: Four 'evidence of age' documents are accepted. The Kiwi Access card, costing \$20, is a convenient option for those without a New Zealand driver's license. Application forms are available at your local NZ Post outlet.
